SYLLABUS

On September 9, 2004, the Judicial Inquiry Board filed a complaint with the Courts Commission, charging respondent with conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice and conduct that brings the judicial office into disrepute in violation of the Code of Judicial Conduct, Illinois Supreme Court Rules 61, 62, and 67. In summary form, the complaint alleged that from March 2003 to March 2004, respondent conducted an unsuccessful campaign in the Republican primary for a Circuit Court Judge position in DuPage County, Illinois. In connection with this campaign, respondent circulated numerous campaign materials which contained graphic and sensational images, several misrepresentations and statements which committed and appeared to commit respondent with respect to certain issues.

Held: Respondent censured.
