SYLLABUS

On February 21, 2003, the Judicial Inquiry Board filed a complaint with the Courts Commission, charging respondent with persistent failure to perform his duties, with conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice and that brings the judicial office into disrepute in violation of the Code of Judicial Conduct, Illinois Supreme Court Rules 61 and 63. In summary form, the complaint alleged that since at least 1997, respondent failed to promptly dispose of the business of the court in time-sensitive cases and to diligently discharge his administrative responsibilities.

Held: Respondent reprimanded.
